The students pitched tents outside university president John Hennessy's office and have no plans to leave until the college declares a divestment from the fossil fuel industry, student Yari Greaney said.

which prompted an NBC Bay Area investigation that resulted in the refunds.



# Refugee debate growing

# Driver dies after highway accident

A motorist was killed on Highway 101 in Mountain View after he veered off the road and hit a metal guardrail, a CHP officer said yesterday.

Phiet Truong, 67, of San Jose, was merging onto Highway 85 southbound from Highway 101 around 10 p.m. Sat-

urday when he veered to the right for unknown reasons, Officer Art Montiel said. Officers arrived and found Truong suffering from major injuries, Montiel said. He was taken to Stanford Hospital, where he later died.

There were no other cars involved in the crash, Montiel said. Officers are still investigating the crash, he said.

# Tech wearables firm sells for \$260 million

The watch firm Fossil has bought the Burlingame-based fitness tech wearables company Misfit for \$260 million, according to media reports.

Misfit founder Sonny Vu will become Fossil's president and chief technology officer of connected devices, the San Francisco Business Times reported.

Misfit has failed to keep pace with larger rivals like Apple and its smart-watch. That made it an ideal target for an acquisition, which it completed in a cash and debt deal, and a good fit for Fossil.

"Like us, Fossil Group is entrepreneurial, rooted in great design and is always looking forward and innovat-

ing to bring the best products to market that delight consumers," Misfit said in a statement. "Together, we will be stronger and uniquely positioned to lead the convergence of style and technology."

Misfit had raised about \$64 million since it was founded in 2011. Its investors include Khosla Ventures, Norwest Venture Partners, Xiaomi, Founders Fund and Horizons Ventures.

The purchase didn't come as a huge surprise for Fossil, after CEO Kosta Kartsois said in an earnings call earlier this year that it has been eyeing wearables companies in a bid to diversify its offerings and cash in on the fitness trend.

# Man robs 7-Eleven clerk but returns some cash

A man who robbed a 7-Eleven clerk in Redwood City came back later and returned some of the money he took, police said.

The clerk was counting money in the store's parking lot at 1700 Broadway at around 10 p.m. Friday when a man ran up behind him, snatched the mon-

ey and fled in a silver four-door Honda, according to police Lt. Sean Hart. Roughly 30 minutes later, the robber returned and gave back a portion of the money to the clerk, Hart said. Hart declined to disclose how much money was taken or returned. No arrests have been made.

# Liquor store robber sought

San Mateo County sheriff's deputies are seeking a suspect who allegedly robbed a San Carlos liquor store.

At 7:21 p.m. Friday, a man entered Shamrock Liquors, located at 1117 Laurel St., according to the sheriff's office. The man then forced a store employee behind the counter and demanded money, sheriff's officials said.

The suspect took an undisclosed amount of cash from the register and pushed the employee to the ground be-

fore leaving the store, according to the sheriff's office.

The suspect was last seen on foot heading south on Laurel Street, sheriff's officials said.

The store employee suffered a minor injury to his hand and was treated at the scene, according to the sheriff's office.

The incident was captured by the store's surveillance camera and investigators are reviewing the footage, sheriff's officials said.
