Cheerleader attacked

A College of San Mateo cheerleader was beaten up after an argument over a football game, San Mateo police said yesterday. Only minor injuries to the cheerleader were reported, said public

information officer Amanda Von Glahn. The incident allegedly began after a heated argument about the game, which occurred on 6 p.m. on Saturday, Von Glahn said.

Police received a description of the suspect in the case, who was reported to be with two or three other men. However, they are not releasing information about the suspect.

City aims to keep man's guns

The city of Burlingame filed a motion in court to keep someone's guns away from them following a domestic violence arrest in July.

However, the person's name has been redacted from the legal documents filed in San Mateo County Superior Court on Tuesday. This is because Burlingame City Attorney Kathleen Kane said she wants to "avoid damage done to individuals" who are trying to "put their lives back together."

Kane cited an incident in the city last year in which a man had attempted to kill himself and had

affected by the court order. The man's guns are being withheld because on July 29, he was said to have been arrested for domestic violence. He got angry with his wife while they were in their car. Right to know

She said that the right to know when someone's guns are taken away is a legitimate public interest, but added that she wishes to minimize the harm done to those

Three guns are being withheld. They are a Daniel Defense Rifle, a Beretta handgun and a Mossberg 500A shotgun, according to the claim.

Harbor district to survive for now

The San Mateo County Board of Supervisors is reconsidering earlier plans to dissolve the embattled county Harbor District.

During a board meeting Tuesday morning, the supervisors heard harbor district representatives citing improvements in recent years. They decided to give the district more time to get things in order.

"We are very much looking forward and not back," said Steve McGrath, the general manager of the harbor district.

The district for years has been dealing with significant employee turnover, an unbalanced budget,

harassment lawsuits and meetings in which police have been needed to keep the peace, among other things. All of this led to a civil grand jury in 2014 recommending to the county supervisors that the district be dissolved. In June, the grand jury wrote a report questioning why the district had not yet been dismantled.

Improvements cited

However, improvements have been made. The harbor district board has approved paying off \$5 million in loans to the California Division of Boating and Waterways, OK'd a switch for workers compensation insurance, saving

the district \$78,000 annually, and began an "open gov" website, which helps provide financial transparency.

The supervisors on Tuesday approved a response to the civil grand jury's report and changed a vital word. It changed "will" to "may" in reference to the dissolution of the district.

Meeting with district

Supervisor Don Horsley, who represents much of the harbor district, said that he meets with McGrath and Tom Mattusch, president of the harbor board, at least once a month. Horsley said he has seen improvements.

Strait also emphasized that it was a genuinely serious and scary situation.
